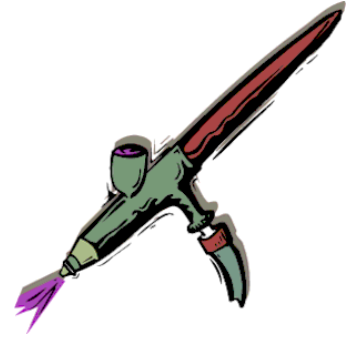

Robert Butler

Airbrush Seminar

12/01/2018 11am-2pm



Life long Artist and teacher, Robert Butler, trained in classical art at Vesper George School of Art in Boston, MA. In his four decades of professional experience he has taught students of all ages in the disciplines of realistic human figure rendering, wildlife and landscape painting, mural work, taxidermy recreations and historical military figure miniature painting. His techniques include both traditional brush and canvas mediums and airbrushing.

Mr. Butler is known for his relaxed yet detailed classroom style, having taught students throughout the USA. His work has been exhibited at the Smithsonian National Museum, has been shown in scientific programming for broadcast television and his work is held in private collections worldwide. He created, chaired and taught painting seminars at the "Fantastic Model Miniatures" exhibitions held at the Museum of Our National Heritage in Lexington, MA. Mr. Butler taught airbrushing at the New England Taxidermy Association conventions and currently teaches students K through adult at MA schools. He runs "The East Coast Miniature Figure Artist's group and is an instructor for the Badger Airbrush Company.

The Mystic Carvers Club and the Connecticut Woodcarvers Assn have had "booths" for several years at the "Big E" grounds in West Springfield for the Woodworking Shows weekend in January. In Jan '18, Mystic was given a space with 3 tables (2 at front, one on side) and Ct Woodcarvers had a space bigger than that.

A benefit to those who "work" the booths is that they can come early and stay late, so there is time to check out all of the vendors and free talks/demonstrations as you wish. We usually set up shifts of 2 to 3 hours - 2 on Friday, 3 on Saturday, 2 on

The longest shift is usually the 11AM to 3PM "set up" shift on Friday, when we go in to set up before the Noon opening (we actually spend most of that time casing the joint with none of the public there). I am usually there for that one (with the Mystic crew) and could easily aid in setting up the NEWC booth also..

New England Wood Carvers Highest Award

The NEWC MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARD is given to an active dues-paying member who has made an outstanding contribution to the organization during the current year for services rendered throughout a recent period. Accomplishments made beyond the club's usual meeting place are acceptable providing they satisfy the intent of the guidelines. The award has been presented since 1976 to individuals who have exemplified club services and leadership, NEWC members of record shall cast their vote in the month of April for one of the nominees eligible to receive this award.

NEWC MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARD GUIDELINES for NOMINATION

To be considered for this prestigious award the nominee will have made contributions like the examples given in these guidelines. The nominee's contributions should be substantial and recognized by several people. The examples do not necessarily include everything that a member could have done. They serve as a pathway in helping the nominator to consider carefully all the possible accomplishments this nominee has made that makes him or her worthy of this award. Moreover, it is advisable to speak with people who are closest to the nominee. This step will ensure that all the known credit has been gathered in preparation to completing the nomination form.

1. Inspired people to take up wood carving, helped people to improve their woodcarving skills, recruited people to become members of NEWC, or reached out to the community in a manner that promoted the art of carving.
2. Taught woodcarving in different settings, tutored one or more individuals, demonstrated carving methods in use today, or made presentations of carvings in a variety of settings before an audience.
3. Exhibited personal works of accomplishments, entered carvings in competition, contributed to various publications. Or was/is an active carving instructor.
4. Is now or may have been an officer of the club, directed a club project, worked in some capacity in the Spirit of Wood Show, or
